Formation and Ministry

Ignatian Values Day #2

On Tuesday, November 1, as we celebrate the feast of All Saints with the Universal Catholic Church, Saint Ignatius College Prep will also host our second Ignatian Values Day (IVD). (Please note that this is a "Church attire" day for students.) Guided by our Jesuit mission, specifically the Grad at Grad values of Loving and Being Open to Growth, we will engage in dialogue around the important issues of race and racial justice.

The day will begin with Mass in Holy Family celebrated by Most Reverend Bishop Joseph Perry, an auxiliary Bishop in Chicago and one of the leaders of the cause for the sainthood of Servant of God Father Augustus Tolton. Tolton, the first African-American Catholic priest in the United States, lived and ministered among African-Americans who were trapped in deep poverty in Chicago at the end of the 19th century.

Following Mass, students and adults will engage in activities and important conversations about race and bias. Both during and in advance of the IVD, the school has partnered with the Anti-Defamation League (ADL), a national leader in combating discrimination in schools and other institutions, for a series of student and SICP adult training sessions. The ADL program prepares students and adults to: recognize bias and the harm it inflicts on individuals and society; build understanding of the value and benefits of diversity; improve inter-group relations, and confront racism.

Following IVD, we look forward to continuing programming around race and racial justice through student ISEED diversity dialogues, conversations within Religious Studies classes, and a prayer service entitled "A Night of Remembrance" to pray for victims of oppression. Each of us is called to respond to Jesus by building the Kingdom of God here on earth.
