IHSA Sectional Champions!!!

Boys Var Swimming & Diving (2/17)

The Wolfpack captured first place at the IHSA Sectional Championships on Saturday. The Pack were led by a pair of double event winners - Jacob Furlong (200 free / 500 free) and Parker Nolan (50 free / 100 free). Nolan's times set new Fr/So & Varsity school records while Furlong's 200 was a new meet record. Ezra Mizgala (100 fly) and Michael Schiml (100 breast) each took top honors in meet record fashion. Furlong, Nolan, Mizgala and Anthony Severino grabbed first in the 200 free relay with a new Varsity and Meet record. Furlong, Nolan, Mizgala and Bradley Yendro capped off the meet with a win in the 400 free relay. Colin Stelmach was runner up in the 1M Diving to advance to state and set a new Varsity record. Liam Shannon, Schiml, Severino and Gus Enger qualified for state in the medley relay as did Mizgala in the 50 free and Yendro in the 100 free. Additional podium finishers include Yendro (200 free), Schiml (200 IM), Shannon (200 IM / 100 back), Severino (100 fly), Moises Lopez (500 free) and Brady Bartels (100 breast).

MCAC Champions!!!

Boys Var Swimming & Diving (2/3)

The Pack captured first place at the MCAC championships over the weekend. The Pack won 7 of the 12 events and set four new conference records, two pool records and two school records. Jacob Furlong took home conference titles in both the 200 and 500 free setting conference and pool records in both and was named senior swimmer of the year. Ezra Mizgala also grabbed a pair of individual conference titles (50 free / 100 fly) and set a new conference record in the 100 fly. Michael Schiml took top honors in the 100 breaststroke to go with a 4th place finish in the 200 IM. Mizgala, Parker Nolan, Anthony Severino and Furlong took the top spot in the 200 free relay. Nolan, Mizgala, Bradley Yendro and Mizgala capped the meet off with a win and conference record in the 400 free relay. All Conference performances also included Parker Nolan in the 50 free / 100 free both of which were new Fr/So school records, Colin Stelmach (1M Diving), Liam Shannon (100 back) and Brady Bartels (100 breast). Top 8 performances include the 200 medley relay (Shannon, Schiml, Severino, Gus Enger), Bradley Yendro (200 free / 100 free), Shannon (200 IM), Severino (100 fly) and Gavin Bohan (1M Diving).

Wolfpack Make History - Win MCAC Championship!!!

Boys FR/SO Swimming & Diving (2/3)

For the first time in school history the Wolfpack took top honors at the MCAC Conference Championships. The Pack won 9 of the 11 events including a sweep of the relays. Luke Hunneke (200 IM/100 breast) and Conor Shannon (50 free / 100 free) each picked up conference crowns and were named co-swimmers of the meet. Hunneke set a new meet record in the 200 IM. Moises Lopez led a 1-2-3 finish in the 200 free and John McDermott won the 500 free. Chris Kull, Brady Bartels, Hunneke and Morgan Harrell opened the meet with a win in the 200 medley relay. Luke Siwik, Hunneke, Bartels and Shannon won the 200 free relay and Lopez, McDermott, Siwik and Shannon capped off the meet with a win in the 400 free relay.

Additional top 8 finishers include Siwik (200 free / 100 free), McDermott (200 free), Harrell (200 IM / 500 free), Bartels (50 free), Peter Digenan (50 free / 100 breast), Kull (100 fly / 100 back) and Charlie Lewis (100 back). Both the B 200 free and 400 free relay finished 4th. The 200 included Lopez, Jacob Conroy, Digenan, McDermott and 400 included Lewis, Harrell, Kull Manuel Arriola

Wolfpack Place 4th at Conference Meet

The Wolfpack finished 4th in the team standings and won 4 of the 11 events. Daniel Hwang led the way for the Pack picking up a pair of conference titles in the 200 IM and 100 breast. Luke Christy also grabbed an individual title in the 50 free. Sebastian Caniglia, Hwang, Tommy Howard and Christy started off the meet winning the 200 medley relay! Both the free relays finished 3rd – 200 free (Howard, Christy, Derrick Stokes, Nikhil Robinson) and 400 free (Robinson, Howard, Hwang, Caniglia). Top 8 performances include Robinson (200 free / 500 free), Caniglia (50 free / 100 free), Howard (100 fly), Stokes (100 fly / 100 breast) and Christy (100 free).

Wolfpack Win Lockport Invite

Boys Var Swimming & Diving (1/20)

The Pack captured 1st place at the 15 meet field at the Lockport Invite. The Pack captured first place in 8 of the events including a sweep of the relays. Jacob Furlong (200 free / 500 free) and Ezra Mizgala (50 free / 100 fly) were each double event winners. Michael Schiml picked up a win in the 100 breaststroke. Liam Shannon, Schiml, Parker Nolan and Anthony Severino won the 200 medley relay. Furlong, Bradley Yendro, Severino, Mizgala grabbed fist in the 200 free relay. The 400 free relay capped off the meet with a win setting a new meet record. Parker Nolan led off with a new meet record in the 100 free and Yendro, Mizgala and Furlong finished off for the victory. Additional top 8 performers include Parker Nolan (runner up in 50 free / 100 fly), Bradley Yendro (200 free / 100 free), Michael Schiml (200 IM), Anthony Severino (100 fly), Liam Shannon (500 free / 100 back), Daniel Hwang (100 breast) and the B 400 free relay (Liam Shannon, Conor Shannon, Luke Siwik, Moises Lopez).

Pack Win R-B Invite

Boys Var Swimming & Diving (1/13)

The Wolfpack won the R/B Invite on Saturday winning 9 of the 12 events including a sweep of the relays. Three new pool records were established including 2 by Jacob Furlong in the 200 and 500 free. Furlong teamed up with Anthony Severino, Parker Nolan and Ezra Mizgala to set a new mark in the 400 free relay. Mizgala was a double event winner in the 50 free / 100 fly and Parker Nolan and Michael Schiml each picked up wins in the 100 free and 100 breast respectively. Both the 200 medley (Liam Shannon, Schiml, Mizgala, Bradley Yendro) and 200 free (Yendro, Nolan, Severino, Furlong) relays posted best season times in taking first place. Podium performances include Stelmach (1M Diving), Nolan (200 free), Schiml (200 IM), Shannon (50 free), Severino (100 fly) and Yendro (100 free).

Strong Weekend at New Trier Diving Invite and Evanston Invite

Boys Var Swimming & Diving (1/6)

At the New Trier Diving Invite Colin Stelmach finished 7th and Gavin Bohan finished 28th in the very strong field. At the Evanston Invite the Pack finished 4th out of 18 teams that featured 8 of the top 20 teams in the state. Jacob Furlong was a double event winner taking both the 200 and 500 free. Ezra Mizgala took top honors in the 100 fly and set a new meet record in the process to go along with a 3rd place finish in the 50 free. Parker Nolan finished 3rd in the 100 fly and 4th in the 50 free. Furlong, Mizgala, Nolan and Bradley Yendro finished 3rd in the 400 free relay. Anthony Severino swam the 200 free relay with Furlong, Mizgala and Nolan to a 6th place finish. Top 12 performances include a 9th place finish in the 200 medley relay (Liam Shannon, Michael Schiml, Severino, Gus Enger), Yendro finishing 10th in the 200 free and 100 free and Schiml taking 8th in the 100 breast.

Wolfpack Win Highland Park Pentathlon

Boys JV Swimming & Diving (12/27)

The Wolfpack took first place at the Highland Park Pentathlon on all three levels marking the first time the team has accomplished this. Ezra Mizgala claimed the high point award for the A division and set two meet records in winning the 50 free and 50 fly. Parker Nolan finished 3rd in the high point standings. On the B level Ignatius had 3 of the top 6 high point winners with Gus Enger taking 2nd, Daniel Hwang 3rd and Conor Shannon 5th. The Pack dominated the C level finishing 1-2-3 in the high point standings led by Sebastian Caniglia, Nikhil Robinson and Tommy Howard.

Wolfpack 2nd at Highland Park

Boys JV Swimming & Diving (12/9)

The team finished 2nd overall at the Highland Park Pentathlon on Saturday. The team was second in the Novice division, third in the JV division and second in the JV/V division. The Pack opened up the season with a 3rd place finish at the Warrior Relays on Friday at Deerfield High School. The highest relay finish of the day was the diving duo of Colin Stelmach and Gavin Bohan who finished 2nd place in a very tight race amongst the top 3 schools. The Fr/So foursome of Liam Shannon, Daniel Hwang, Nikhil Robinson and Luke Christy finished 3rd in both the 200 medley and free relays to reach the podium. Fourth place relays include the 500 Crescendo (Robinson, Gus Enger, Conor Shannon, Bradley Yendro), the 300 IM (Michael Schiml, Luke Hunneke, Brady Bartels), the 300 back (Yendro, L. Shannon, Christy) and the 400 free (Yendro, C Shannon, Anthony Severino, Enger).
