Students who graduate from St. Ignatius College Prep are...

Open to Growth ...are responsible for their actions ...are conscious of their feelings... are open to a variety of inner movements and esthetic emotions... possess a habit of reflection.

Intellectually Competent ...possess logical and critical thinking skills ...have precision in written and oral expression ...foster in themselves general knowledge throughout a variety of disciplines ...are willing to relate current events to cultural antecedents ...are growing in awareness of global social problems and public policy implications ...are growing in critical consciousness and moral ambiguities.

Religious ...read the Gospels and encounter Christ in them ...have a basic understanding of the Church's teaching and mission ...are aware of their own responsibility to explore and validate their faith life ...have had some personal experience of God ...appreciate the living community of the Church as celebrated in the Eucharist ...are continually becoming men and women for others.

Loving ...learn to trust the fidelity of friends, family, and adults ...experience felt moments of God's love and loving self ...come to grips with prejudice, stereotypes and uncharitable behavior ...learn to extend self in order to build up community ...develop mature relationships with other young men and women ...are sensitive to the beauty of our created universe.



Committed to Doing Justice ...are more aware of selfish tendencies ... see how faith is a commitment to a just society ... participate in community service programs ...are aware of and act upon public policies, social issues, and the demands of a just society.
